C. Institution Features

- Hankuk University of Foreign Studies is the birthplace of foreign language education in Korea and teaches 45 languages of Asia, the Middle East and other major regions of the world. HUFs graduates now play vital roles in international trade and diplomatic affairs. In addition to its focus on the theory and practice of foreign languages, HUFs also encourages students to use the language skills that they have acquired to study the politics, economy, society and culture of each region of the world. HUFs is a specialized university that educates students to become creative experts, international Koreans and independent researchers who will contribute to the development and exchange of culture. HUFs is a coeducational school with around 17,000 undergraduate students in 78 departments within 18 colleges. HUFs has educational exchange ties with 602 universities in 97 countries worldwide.

2. Program Information

A. PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- completed at least one semester at their home university at the time of participation;
- be enrolled in an undergraduate degree program at their home university during the semester;
- and their GPA should be over 3.5 out of 4.5.
- be available to prove the bank account balance of \$6800 or more in the name of

the participant or parents:(except students from Japan)

B. Financial Statement(except students from Japan)

- HUFS is not the party requiring financial documents for your exchange
- the Ministry of Justice (i.e., Immigration) is now requiring that exchange students submit (to the univeristy) proof of financial stability following the length of their exchanges:

◇ 4 months - 6,800 USD

- This amount must be in a bank account (i.e., a savings account/checking account) in your or your parents' names. Your last names must match or you need to also submit to HUFS a document showing the family relationship. This statement will be requested around the time that we start issuing the Certificates of Admission as your statement must be issued within 30 days of the Certificate's issuance date.

C. LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

- Applicants need to be proficient either in English or Korean.

A. Areas of Study Open for Campus Asia Plus Semester Exchange Students

- Students of Campus Asia Plus Semester Exchange Program will belong to the Division of International Studies, but they are eligible to choose from most of the undergraduate courses taught at HUFS(Seoul Campus).

Please look for the "V" designating the class as taught in a foreign language (in the registration website, you will see an "F" for Foreign Language). If the class is not area studies-related (i.e. taught in Chinese, Spanish, etc), it will be taught in English. Always check the syllabus, just to be sure. If there is no "V," that course is taught in Korean. Sometimes, there are mistakes and English-language classes are not marked with a V either - please let us know so we can check with the Department the class is from.

3) English instruction Majors/Departments: You can find classes, which are taught in English, mostly in the following departments/majors:

- * English for International Communication and Conferences (EICC)
- * English Linguistics and Language Technology (ELLT)

- * College of Business (significant registration restrictions exist)
- * Department of International Economics and Law

C. Restricted Courses

- Law School
- Language & Diplomacy
- Language & Trade
- Communicative Languages (a foreign language class which is a student's L1)
- Business College Courses (from late January, 2020): These are not technically restricted, however the College has imposed more requirements that will most likely make it difficult to impossible for Exchange Students to register for any of their courses
 - please see our Nominations Instructions' Important Changes section.

D. ACADEMIC CREDITS

- Credits and Class Hours
 - * One credit: 16 in-class contact hours = 50 minutes of a regular course or 100 minutes of a lab course/ over a period of no less than two weeks.
 - * A single class with 3 HUFS credits = 48 hours of class time.
 - * 12 credits per semester = 192 hours of time spent in class. This does not include any study work spent outside of the lecture/lab period.
- 18 HUFS credits are the very maximum we can allow for exchange and visiting students to take during one semester.
- It is recommended to check with their home university about the credit transfer in advance.

5. Housing Information

- The students of CAMPUS Asia Plus Semester Exchange Program have to look for accommodation by themselves. We recommend you to apply for the houses offered by HUFS. HUFS offers its students on-campus housing "GlobeeDorm" and off-campus housing "International House A&E". Off-campus housing "International House A&E" is directly across the street from the front or rear gate of campus. There is little to no difference in the commute time to various buildings/classrooms around campus. Please check the following website for further information.
